YJ1: CAREER EXPLORATION

Youth Jobs One is for young people ages 14-19 to build their foundational job skills through their first or second work opportunity. YJ1 primarily provides city-subsidized summer jobs at parks, libraries and nonprofits.



Youth Jobs Two builds on those foundational skills by providing paid internships to young people ages 16-21 at organizations and businesses across industries.








